The Singing Turtle A humorous story with a great moral lesson. Two brothers, who are complete opposites, care for their aging mother. A singing turtle unexpectedly arrives on the scene, and exposes the true characters of the brothers.

The Mouse Bride Father Mouse and his family reside in the Emperor's Palace. It is time for his daughter, Chuko, to marry, and he decides only the greatest will be acceptable for her husband. Father Mouse is surprised and humbled when the perfect mate for Chuko is revealed.

The Two Frogs The Osaka frog and the Kyoto frog desired to visit each other's place because 'the grass is always greener on the other side.' In the end, they believed that Osaka and Kyoto, which are as different to look at as two towns can be, were as alike as two peas.
